QDI Clerical Staff this is Your Agreement

The Australian Services Union Officials together with your JCC have met with QDI Management on numerous occasions throughout 2009 in the quest to gain Clerical Employees not only a fair wage increase, but also improvements to your conditions.

Management have continually denied Clerical Staff what they are currently providing for other staff.

However, due to the ASU continuing to remind QDI Management of their legal obligations under the Fair Work Act, some staff have been provided with a Notice of Employee representational Rights.

This notice clearly states that QDI gives notice that it is bargaining in relation to an Enterprise Bargaining Agreement for Queensland Diagnostic Imaging Clerical Employees.

This is great news for Clerical Staff and the ASU is prepared to recommence negotiations for a long awaited wage increase for staff.

As this notice states, you have the right to appoint a bargaining representative, however, the ASU remains the default bargaining agent.

You can now rest assured that your interests will be taken very seriously and you will receive the most up to date information after each meeting.

Negotiations have been going on since 2008, but unfortunately stalled mid 2009.

The Australian Services Union remains committed to its obligation to update your expired Collective Agreement and obtain Clerical Staff their much overdue wage increases.
